April	Bagless Day 1: Environmental concern: Recycle
April	Recycle Clothes: (2 Pillow covers to be made)
	Requirements:
	Pillow, T-shirt, Scissors, Fabric marker, Measuring tape, Ruler.
	Method:
	Measure the length and width of the pillow with the tape.
	The t-shirt should obviously be larger in size than the pillow. Using the fabric marker,
	draw the dimensions of the pillow on the shirt. Add 2 inches gap to both sides and cut
	out the front and back of the t-shirt.

If the pillow is rectangular or square in shape, it will benefit you to cut a 1 sq. inch section away from each of the corners of the shirt.

Draw 4 dotted lines, 1 inch away from each side of the shirt. The dotted lines should meet at the corners.

Cut $\frac{1}{4}$ inch strips that are parallel to the side of the shirt. Ensure that you do not cut the strips beyond the dotted lines.

Take the pillow and place the front of the shirt on top, so as to align the almost-finished cover on top of the pillow.

Take strips from the shirt to tie all the four corners to give the pillow cover a frilly look.

Bagless Day 2: Creative Minds: Making Pom Pom Key chain

Requirements: Wool, Scissors, Cardboard, Keychain ring, Fevicol, Decorative items-Glitter, Pair of eyes.

Method:

Step 1:Trace out a a circle on a piece of cardboard. The size of your circle will be the size of your pom pom. I used a measuring cup that was around the size I wanted to trace the circle.

Step 2:Cut out circle.

Step 3:Draw a smaller circle within the circle.

Step 4:Cut out the little circle.

Step 5:Make a small "v" where you cut out the little circle to make the yarn easier to pull through. Repeat steps 1-5 to make a second circle.

Step 6: Hold the two circles together and wrap the yarn through the notch and around evenly around the sides of the circle.

Step 7: Wrap the yarn until the circle in the middle is filled in.

Step 8:Use a pair of scissors to cut the yarn between the two circles all the way around.

Step 9: Cut a length of yarn and tie a tight knot around the middle of the pom-pom.

Bring the yarn around the other side and tie another, the tighter the better! Step 10: Trim the pom pom to make it round and even.

Step 11: Attach a keychain ring with the help of a fevicol/ secure it with a knot.

Step 12: Make different decorative items using these poms poms. For eg: attach it to the pillow cover you made yesterday or make a wall hanging, also you paste the eyes on a big pom pom to make a face.

Baglight Day- Last day of the month: Blind Draw Team Building Activity Running the Activity Explain the activity:

- 1. Each team appoints one member to be the representative and the representative will be then separated from the rest of the group.
- 2. The remaining team members select a chit (made by the teacher) with an item mentioned on it and will instruct the representative to draw it without saying what the item is.
- 3. There is a time limit of 3 minutes for the drawing to be completed.
- 4. Each flipchart is positioned to face away from the group so that they cannot see what the representative is drawing.
- 5. The team whose drawing is closest to the actual item will win the game.
- 6. At the end of the activity, all the drawings are revealed.

Rules: The team cannot tell the representative what their item is; they can only give instructions.

- 9. The "artist" cannot ask any questions and can only draw based on the instructions given by their team.

Bagless Day 1: How to make a storage organizer.

Requirement: Cardboard, Printed paper, Glue, pencil and scale, Cutter and scissors. (Optional: Colours, Glitter)

Method:

- 1. Take cardboard firstly and cut out pieces with measurements 10×5 cm, 10×8 cm, 10×12 cm, 10×15 cm, and lastly two pieces of 10×18 cm. Use a cutter for accuracy.
- 2. Now take a printed sheet and wrap all the cardboard pieces with it using some glue. Wrap properly from all sides for complete finishing.
- 3.Again, take cardboard and cut out strips measuring 11×3.5 cm and 6×3 cm out of it. Cut one of the lower sides a slant cut. Take a printed sheet and cover the strips similarly using some glue.
- 4. Now take one of the 10×18 cm sheets and use it as a base. On it, stick all the cardboard from bigger to smaller sizes for a slant look.
- 5. Take the small strips and apply glue on three sides and stick it properly in between the cardboard sheets to form different drawers. Give the cardboard strips a slant looks by sticking them in a slant position.

September

Baglight Day - Last day of the month: STEAM project: PENNY SPINNER STEM CHALLENGE

Requirements: Paper plate, Round cup, Markers (optional), Scissors, Penny.

Method:

Trace around the outside of a cup on a paper plate using the pen to make a circle. Cut out the circle. Use a ruler to find the center of the circle and mark it with a pen. Place the ruler on the center of the circle and draw a line to create halves. Turn the circle and draw another line across the circle to create quarters. Draw two more lines through the center of each quarter to create eighths. Use the markers to color each eighth or draw patterns in each section. Cut a slit in the center of the circle slightly smaller than a penny. Push the penny through the slit. Holding the penny between your fingers, spin the penny spinner on a flat surface. (To do the penny spinner STEM challenge: Use a small paper plate, similar to a dessert plate to make this easier to do with small children. If you only have large paper plates, simply cut out a smaller circle from the plate. Provide children with the materials needed and allow them to colour their plate if they like, letting them know that as the plate spins all of the colors will merge together and create a rainbow effect. The children tested their predictions, those who placed the penny on top found that the plate didn't spin, those with the penny under the plate found that the plate spun off of the penny, and those with the penny placed through the middle of the plate found that their penny spinner worked! Once they discovered that placing the penny through the plate allowed them to create a spinner, they got to work perfecting and decorating their spinners!

October

Bagless Day 1: Flowers garlands from plastic bags.

Material required: Plastic bags - lots of pretty colours! - Green string - preferably something quite stiff. **Scissors-** A sewing needle - one with an eye big enough to thread your string through. - A knitting needle - or anything pointy.

Procedure:

- 1) Take a plastic bag and cut the handles and bottom off. Now you should have a plastic tube.
- 2) Cut straight along one edge of the tube to make it into a sheet.
- 3) Now cut your sheet into strips about 4cm thick (that's about 1.5").
- 4) Take a strip and fold in one edge by about 2.5cm (1"). Keep folding it over and over so you end up with a flat roll of plastic.
- 5) Now cut the roll.
- 6) Unfold the shape you cut out. You should now have a long strip of petal shapes! Repeat steps 4 to 6 with another one of the strips you made in step 3. this should give your enough petals to make a good-sized flower. You can of course do more, or less, depending on how big you want your flowers to be.

ATTACHING THE STEM: 7) Cut three equal lengths of the green string. Each one should be a little more than twice the length you want your stem to be. Take the flower head you just made and remove the needle. Widen that hole with the knitting needle. It needs to be quite big, but take care not to rip the plastic.

- 8) Now thread each length of string through the hole so that the flower head sits at the midpoint of each.
- 9) Tie up each string. This holds the flower head together.
- 10) Now pair up the ends of the original three lengths and braid them together tightly. 11) Before you run out of string, tie the ends together.
- 12) Chop off the extra string.15) To finish off your rose, play around with opening out the petals so that they look nice.
- 13) Make many different styles of flowers and bring them all together to make a beautiful bouquet.

Bagless Day 2: Woollen Doll Making Activity:

Materials Required: 1. Woollen yarn in desired colors. 2. Scissors. 3. Cardboard.

4. Ruler. 5. Pen/pencil.

Method: Steps: 1. Cut a cardboard piece in the size you want your doll to be.

- 2. Start wrapping the wool around the cardboard piece. You can use a single colour or mix colours.
- 3. Keep wrapping until the wool covers the cardboard thickness fully.
- 4. Cut the wool and tuck it in the wrapped wool tightly, using a thread. Make sure that the in-tucked wool is secure and it doesn't come out. This will be the head of the doll
- 5. Cut a piece of yarn in a contrasting colour in about an arm's length. This piece will be used to form the hands and feet of the doll.
- 6. Wrap the yarn around 2-3 fingers, depending on the size you want.
- 7. Knot the centre of this looped yarn with another yarn using a double knot. This forms the arms and legs of the doll.
- 8. Slip the thread through wool head and take it out from the other end. Now, tie the arms to the head with the help of a single knot. Do this twice, so the arms stick together.
- 9. Repeat the process with the legs and tie them to the base of the head.
- 10. Take another contrasting colour yarn and tie it to the neck part. Use scissors and cut the yarn from the non-knotted end. This will create the hair of the doll.
- 11. Trim the woollen fringes according to your doll's hair length preference.
- 12. Take another contrasting colour of yarn for the dress. Tie it under the head of the doll, and insert it between the wrapped wool. Pull the yarn inside, loosely wrap it around the wrap, and again insert it inside from inside the wrap after a couple of rows. Keep repeating this process until you reach the desired dress length.
- 13. Once done, tie a knot and tuck the loose end inside the dress neatly.
- 14. Shape the doll as per your preference, using your hands or scissors.
- 15. Finally, your cute and colourful woollen doll is ready to play with.

November

Baglight Day- Last day of the month: Pillar candle carving painting and decorating.

Material required: Two Pillar candles (colour), mica powder, paint, paint brushes, craving blunt instrument.

Procedure: Take the candles and crave the shapes of the flowers, leaves, buildings (anything that you are comfortable with)

decorate the candle by using paint and mica powder. Students can also use any decorative items available to them.

December

Bagless Day 1: Glass Painting.

Requirement: 2 glass jars, 2 glass plates, 2 glass bottles, Used CD, Glitter, Laces, glue Cardboard, Paper, or Dropcloth, Disposable Gloves

Masking Tape, Glassware, Paint Suitable for Glass, Paint Brushes.

Procedure:

- 1. Glass ware needs to be cleaned and make sure to remove any residue from the labels.
- 2. Wear disposable gloves.
- 3. Put a little amount of paint in the jar, Swirl the paint around so it comes up the sides as much as you want. If you need more paint, you can add some, but you don't add so much that the paint pools on the bottom. Roll the jar periodically as it dries so that the paint doesn't settle into one spot.
- 4. Paint the jar from the outside, Make upward dabs or strokes of paint in one color, then let it dry. Add another layer of strokes in a color that will go well with the first color. You can even overlap the paint in several layers to create additional shades. 5. Let the paint dry
